The 9/11 Never Forget Exhibit is coming to Connecticut for the first time and will be at the Berlin Fair from Friday October 2nd through Sunday October 4th, 2015. In 2013, the Stephen Siller Tunnel to Towers Foundation created a mobile exhibit as a tribute to all whose lives were sacrificed on September 11, 2001. The 9/11 NEVER FORGET Mobile Exhibit is a tool to educate America's youth about the historic events of that day. Welcomed around the country, from communities in Phoenix, Arizona to Tampa, Florida, the 9/11 NEVER FORGET Mobile Exhibit – a high-tech, 53-foot tractor-trailer, which unfolds into a 1,000 square foot exhibit, serves as a poignant reminder of that tragic day. Public safety personnel representing state and local police departments, fire departments, EMS, and the Connecticut Patriot Guard Riders will be escorting the exhibit into Berlin Friday morning October 2nd. The escort is scheduled to leave the I-84 rest stop in Southington at 0800 hours and will arrive at the Berlin fairgrounds at approximately 0830. Members of the community are invited to come out and watch the exhibit's arrival Friday morning.

The escort route is as follows:

- I-84 eastbound to the Route 372 Corbin Avenue exit in New Britain.
- Route 372 Corbin Avenue eastbound into Berlin all the way down to Webster Square Road.
- Webster Square Road to Woodlawn Road.
- Woodlawn Road to the Berlin Turnpike northbound.
- Berlin Turnpike northbound to Route 160 Deming Road.
- Route 160 Deming Road eastbound to Bacon Lane.
- Bacon Lane to Wethersfield Road.
- Wethersfield Road to #525 Beckley Road the Berlin Fairgrounds.
