R.A.D. (Rape Aggression Defense) Instruction



The Berlin Police Department will be offering a women's self-defense tactics course December 11th – 13th at Berlin High School. The course will be held in the east mezzanine from 5:30 PM to 8:30 PM each night. Officer Tyler Cyr and Detective Ted Fuini are certified instructors of the R.A.D. (Rape Aggression Defense) system and will be teaching the class.

The R.A.D. system balances the need for women to acquire self-defense education in a relatively short period of time, with the lifelong commitment required for physical skill mastery. The course involves three, three-hour blocks of instruction, designed to work in tandem to progressively build self-defense skills. For this reason attendance is required at all three sessions. The course will be comprised of both lecture and practical skills that require moderate physical activity.

The course is open to women who work or reside in Berlin and participants must be at least 16 years of age. There is no cost associated with the training and it will be limited to twenty people on a first come first served basis.
